What's happening?

The Partnership of the Manitoba Capital Region (PMCR) is pleased to present the next round of public open house events as part of the Manitoba Capital Region Transportation Planning Process. The plan will result in a "road map" to guide future transportation decision-making in the Capital Region. What is a Transportation Master Plan?

A Transportation Master Plan is a long-range plan for an area which identifies transportation infrastructure requirements for all types of transportation. The planning process analyzes the existing transportation network use and projected demand based upon population projections, future land uses and transportation trends. The plan will prioritize network improvements staged over a 5, 10 and 20 year time frame. In addition, the plan will provide a framework to guide future development of the transportation system within the Capital Regaion.
