- 1. Call to order, welcome, & land acknowledgement Misty Bromley
- 2. Approval of agenda
 - a. Proposed amendments:
 - Increase 2019 year in review and member Q&A period from 20 to 30 minutes (Misty).
 - Add "Approve Seeking Charitable Status" to agenda (Misty).
 - Add a report from the board to the 2019 year in review (Clayton).

Unanimously welcomed the slate.

5. Bylaw amendments overview (motion)

- 6. Motion to seek charitable status
 - a. Clayton Rudy spoke to advantages of operating as a charity

Clayton Rudy moved, Julia Schroeder seconded, all approved.

- 7. 2019 Year in Review Reports
 - a. Executive Director (Mark Cohoe)
 - Southwest Rapid Transit Corridor shows massive latent demand for walking and cycling options.
 - Seine River Bridge/Fermor Tunnel have been completed and avoids floods around Seine River.
 - Garry St. Protected Bike Lane plans came in, indicating positive progress towards new pathways and protected bike lanes.
 - City budget has not reflected commitment to cycling infrastructure and was set back even further in 2019 from \$5 million range to under \$2 million range. This prevents a major funding challenge.
 - Advocacy & outreach overview.
 - COVID-19 presents challenges for 2020: loss of revenue, cancelled events, compressed ride schedule.
 - Major studies moving forward: North Winnipeg Parkway, Leila Avenue Protected Bike Lanes, Keewatin Underpass, West End to University of Winnipeg, Marion Street Protected Bike Lanes, Lagimodiere Twin Bridges Rehabilitation.
 - Federal funding possibilities have arisen as a result of COVID-19.
 - Ride partnerships with various organizations are being built in order to reach a wider variety of communities and people.
 - b. Report from the Board (Clayton Rudy)
 - Overview of 2020 top priorities.
 - Reviewed new projects: Organizational Capacity Development, Bicycle Valet Expansion, Bikeshare Development.
 - Overview of new partnerships & initiatives: Love30on30, Transportation and Land Use Coalition, and Local Bike Groups.
 - c. Bike Valet (Stephanie Chow)
 - 2019 was a good year with many new volunteers for the valet.
 - Events like festivals, climate strike, NHL playoffs, etc. offer promising opportunities.
 - 4 bike valet events were run in 2020 before COVID-19.
 - All events booked in 2020 were re-confirmed for 2021.
 - d. Financial (Misty Bromley)
 - 2019 was difficult for Bike Winnipeg finances (Paypal incident).
 - Grants and sponsorships were up over budget.
 - Mark's remuneration increased \$300 per month.
 - Progress made on bike parking contract (~30 racks installed).
 - Income statement: Bike Winnipeg operated on a loss in 2019.

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- Bike Valet was biggest revenue generator.
- Full conversion from GnuCash to Quickbooks was carried out.
- Stressed importance of monthly donations regardless of the amount.
- See distributed financial update.

Financial report was unanimously approved.
