Adoption of 2013 AGM minutes

- Kevin Miller moves, Jim Falloon seconds
- The motion is passed

Committee reports

- Co-Chairs report (see report) (Jeremy Hull)
 - Advocacy spearheaded by Charles did a very good job advocating for cyclists.
 - Adopted an approach called vision zero
 - Zero deaths on the road
 - It was advocated to municipal and provincial government
 - Cycling safety
 - The education committee spearheaded education courses for cyclists through Manitoba Hydro.
 - Education for motor vehicle operators
- Increase cycling
 - New infrastructure to encourage cycling
 - Bike lanes
 - Separated bike lanes
 - Locations that have new infrastructure are showing increases in cyclists
- Engage public and politicians
 - Good work done during city election

- Met with 25 candidates during the city election to try to form relationships
 - First election where every candidate for mayor talked about active transportation
 - We held a shovel in during the winter so that we could demonstrate that winter cycling is possible
 - We held a priorities workshop during bike week to engage cyclists
 - We haven't had as much success connecting with the provincial government
- Organizational goals
 - Increase membership and participation
 - Not sure if we've accomplished this goal
 - Mark and others have done lots of work taking our trailer to events in the community
 - Volunteers
 - There are many great volunteers within our organization
 - We need someone to take on a volunteer coordination role
 - New meeting structure
 - Every other meeting is a business meeting, the next one will be used to engage members.
 - External committees were created to engage members in Bike Winnipeg work
 - There wasn't much participation in the meetings
 - Fundraising
 - Budget
 - We've really thought out our budget this year thanks to Bill who has created a year to date budget comparison report
 - Funding needed to be generated to cover costs of Bike Winnipeg business
 - We were successful in raising \$5000 dollars this year
 - Bike Valet also had a very successful year. Bike Valet has likely raised approximately \$5000
 - Going forward
 - We need to work on attracting volunteers
 - We need to improve fundraising capacity
 - There is a need to streamline some of our activities to become more efficient
- Fundraising (see report) (Kaye Grant)
 - Managed to achieve
 - Raised \$2000 through members and other partners
 - Had some unexpected bonuses that helped us reach this goal
 - Events
 - Bike Week
 - Strike bike
 - Romi Mayes
 - These events raised a little over \$1500
 - Merchandise
 - \$1700 raised through jersey sale and Black Pearl Coffee sale
 - Looking at t-shirts and decals for the future

- Grants
 - Missed some dates for funding
- Bike Week survey
 - Launched during bike week. Closed October 10th.
 - 302 people completed survey
 - The focus of the survey was to guide us in our priorities moving forward
 - See report
 - We have not determined where people are cycling to and from
- Questions
 - Are the Jersey's still available on the website.
 - The question is yes. Orders will take approximately 6 weeks to process.
- Education report (see report)
 - Hydro cycle
 - Two instructors provided instruction
 - Full day
 - Participants were instructed on rules and were given a skills session
 - High satisfaction rate with the course (Jackie)
 - All but one person was satisfied.
 - The one person was an experienced cyclist felt that the course went to slowly.
 - Strike bike
 - Guided tour of the major events of the Winnipeg General Strike
 - Communication with Winnipeg Transit Representatives
 - Working on creating a dialogue between cyclists and transit operators.
 - Bike education master plan
 - Up until now courses have been offered through leisure guide
 - Looking to move it into schools, community clubs and work places
 - MPI is trying to get more programs into schools
 - Bike Rodeo,
 - Bike Champions (for gym teachers)
 - Curriculum has been developed at certain grade levels, but is optional for health teachers
 - MPI pays \$350 annually to educate 11000 students
 - PUB hearing
 - MPI has made a statement that they would support the education of young people.
 - Although there was no new money allocated for driver education
 - Commuter challenge may be a time to promote education in workplaces and schools
- Financial report (see report) (Bill)
 - We have used up some of our capital paying for staff members
 - We need to do some more work fundraising to help pay for these staff members and other Bike Winnipeg activities
 - Member donations down approximately \$1000
 - Mountain Equipment Co-Op provides us with large grant of \$2000

- Assiniboine Credit Union has also been a large financial supporter of Bike Winnipeg
- We spent \$10,000 in previous years to train 12 CanBike instructors that are now available to educate cyclists in Winnipeg.
- Bike Valet is a large part of our overall financial picture. It is a good source of revenue for our organization.
- We had some exceptional costs this year
 - A net loss of \$11,000 can be attributed to Bike Valet and a t-shirt sale from years ago that didn't work out too well.
- Current year
 - First seven months of this year
 - Membership funds down
 - Fundraising was a major activity (approximately \$3000)
 - Education was a zero cost endeavor
 - We only helped coordinate the Hydro education program
 - Bike Valet is currently up about \$10000
 - We will incur another \$5000 in staff costs
 - We will probably receive another \$2000 in grants before the end of the fiscal year
 - Bill feels we need to look at raising more money through our membership
 - Member questions and comments
 - Is the money being raised for a specific purpose or general revenue
 - The 1 metre project (signs on City of Winnipeg busses) was a successful fundraising drive.
 - This member has suggested that we look at asking for money for specific projects.
 - This member has suggested she may be interested in volunteering to help with this sort of fundraising
 - Another member has suggested that we ask for monthly or yearly donation to give us a more stable source of revenue
 - This is something that Bike Winnipeg has done in the past.
 - It may be worth phoning members instead of sending out paper mail or email.
 - Laura pointed out that a previous board decided that memberships should become lifetime members. This has made it difficult to ask for more money
 - A member suggested that we partner with community clubs to help promote our organization and raise funds for both of our organizations
 - Jeremy Hull – we need more people to donate their time to the fundraising committee in order to be successful
 - A member has pointed out that Bike Winnipeg should make sure that it charges for its services when providing education
 - Jackie responded by saying that the Hydro Cycle was a pilot program that could be brought into other workplaces and we could charge for the service.

- Bill moves the report, Laura seconds, passed
- Bike Valet (Amanda San Filippo)
 - 27 events this year
 - 49 regular volunteers (801 volunteer hours)
 - Additional 128 volunteer hours with non regular volunteers
 - 1 volunteer completed 67 hours of volunteer time
 - Another volunteer completed 118 hours
 - 4898 bicycles parked
 - 25000 bikes parked since Bike Valet's inception
 - We have some permanent structures set up at the Bomber stadium
 - Ellice street festival and MEC bike fest did not have us return this year
 - Partly due to financial reasons
 - We need more grants in the future to help offset the costs of providing free services
 - Bike to work day and Canada Day organizers reduced the amount of time they used Bike Valet's services
 - Revenues down due to this
 - This year we operated without a cargo van (as our last van that had been on loan broke down)
 - This year we provided discounts to organizations that could transport the equipment. On other occasions the bicycle trailer was used (which is very labour intensive)
 - In the future it might be wise to look into finding a company that might donate a vehicle for us to use to transport our equipment
 - Winnipeg Blue Bombers
 - Negotiated for \$8000 for the year (for all 10 bomber games)
 - They established racks and fencing
 - Not enough racks for 800 bicycles
 - Were only able to accommodate 400 bikes
 - A few games we were filled to capacity and had to turn cyclists away
 - Provided us with \$500 in bomber bucks to be used for volunteers
 - Staffing is an issue
 - More volunteer recruitment required next year
 - Another problem was that there was only 1 entrance which made it difficult to get people in and out.
 - There were also some problems with the terrain that slowed volunteers down.
 - Lighting was also an issue
 - More fencing will be needed next year to provide for better security in the compound
 - MPI has started to refer to the Bike Valet as it's Bike Valet even though they have not actually contributed to it
 - Finances
 - This year we brought in \$1600 in donations
 - \$7000 in contract service fees

- \$10000 more to come in
- Operational costs are done
- There should be \$4100 in surplus once expenses have been covered
- If we have to drop the Bomber contract due to problems with MPI, we will be able to continue to run Bike Valet
 - Other organizations have shown interest in Bike Valet services
- Policy report (Jackie Collett)
 - Have currently a draft policy for traffic control measures
 - Will create more policies once they've reported to the board
- Executive Director report
 - Communications
 - Switching from mailman to mailchimp
 - Facebook is where we do a lot of outreach (700 likes)
 - Twitter 1400 followers
 - Display trailer 9 events this year
 - Chamber of commerce
 - Fall concert
 - Was a bit of a wash
 - Bike shorts hasn't worked out
 - Bike Week
 - Active role in planning committee
 - Put on a number of events
 - Cycling strategy
 - Cancelled in July 2013, was reinstated in September 2013
 - Stakeholder workshop in November 2013
 - Will be going before council in early 2015
 - Southwest transit corridor
 - Ensuring they considered active transport
 - Positive impact
 - Connecting communities
 - Improvements on Pembina underpass (2016-2017)
 - Sherbrook bike lane
 - Positive
 - Has encouraged some to bike to work
 - The city needs to work on some intersections
 - Would like to see this model continued
 - Shovel in
 - Timed well with winter cycling congress
 - Need for it, as we have some issues with snow clearing
 - One council candidate was there
 - Considerable media coverage
 - Mark moves report, seconded by Laura, passed

Nomination and voting (Loren Braul)

- Kaye Grant, Ian Walker, Zennon Gagne, Laura Donatelli and Jackie Collett are continuing on for second year.
- Bill Newman and Jeremy Hull plan to stay on if re-elected
- We have 4 vacant positions
 - Derek Yao will fill one of those vacancies
 - Guy Bonetta has asked to be nominated
 - Tyler McCowski will put his name forward
 - Stephane Jorge will put his name forward
- All members that put their names forward are elected through acclamation
